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



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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Development Partners Forum for Government of Balochistan's Community Led Local Governance (CLLG) Policy, organized by the Government of Balochistan, and facilitated by the EU funded BRACE Technical Assistance Project implemented by DAI took place on July 18, 2023. This executive summary provides a comprehensive overview of the event, highlighting the key features of the CLLG policy and the valuable insights shared by distinguished speakers and panelists.

The event started with the recitation of the Holy Qur'an. Surah Rehman, Verse (1-16) of the Holy Quran was recited by Jamal Ud Din, Secretary of Balochi Organizations. The verses emphasized on the many bounties of the Lord and to deal with these bounties with justice and transparency. The resounding verses were a harbinger for the fruitful development forum.

The forum officially commenced with the welcome note of Additional Chief Secretary. Hafiz Abdul Basit, Additional Chief Secretary (Dev) Balochistan, welcomed the guests and expressed his gratitude by mentioning the European Union, Asian Development Bank, and other stakeholders present at the conference for their commitment to the shared vision of the Community Led Local Governance Policy. He highlighted the importance of the forum as a means of networking for resource generation to translate the GoB vision into reality.

The forum was addressed the Chief Secretary Balochistan, Abdul Aziz Uqaili, to outline the policy statement. He praised the CLLG programme for taking a novel approach to traditional community solutions by instituting community-led and community-driven solutions that provide inclusion and legal protection. He stated that the most difficult issue had been the proper channelling of resources, which has now been addressed by the implementation of transparent framework such as MEAL. Simultaneously, he emphasised that observable progress would need additional funding and an ongoing assistance from the donor agencies.

Afterwards, Dostain Khan Jamaldini, Secretary LGRDD GoB, Presented elaborate PPT interspersed with facts and figures. The presentation clearly outlined the CLLG policy framework and implementation mechanisms. He emphasised the CLLG Policy Principles of openness, subsidiarity, empowerment of community organisations, and inclusion, among others. He stressed that the province's government had already allocated PKR 1.5 billion from its own resources, with a further PKR 7.7 billion required to supplement the gap. He added that BRACE TA Project was the driving factor behind the above-mentioned policy principles being institutionalised. Finally, he outlined a five-year implementation plan that will go into force in 2023-24 and expressed optimism for a better Balochistan through the joint efforts of donors and all parties concerned stakeholders.



Following the first round of keynote speeches, Mr. Dostain Khan Jamaldini presented the CLLG Policy in detail, emphasizing key aspects such as addressing governance challenges, decentralization efforts, and the development of community-led local governance policy and the Local Government Sector plan. He underscored the importance of strong policy implementation, technical support, resource mobilization, and the integration of community institutions into the local government system. He elaborated the Genesis and Potential of the Government of Balochistan's Community Led Local Governance (CLLG) Policy, The Way Forward, and proposed Follow-up Actions for the CLLG Policy and its crucial role in receiving support from the Government and Development Partners.

Mr. Stephen Langrell, the EUD Representative, expressed European Union's support for the inclusive CLLG policy. He voiced the EU's satisfaction in collaborating with the Government of Balochistan and confirmed that the EU considers Balochistan a priority area and praised the CLLG Policy. He emphasised the need of accountability, transparency, and sustainability as policy concepts for the EU that the GoB should implement to guarantee that resources are channelled to the grassroots level.

Ms. Samar Ehsan, Additional Secretary EAD, wholeheartedly commended the extraordinary efforts undertaken by the Government of Balochistan (GoB) regarding the formulation of the commendable Policy. Expressing her satisfaction, she mentioned how the current strides in poverty alleviation have not only encouraged them but also instilled confidence for a brighter future ahead. In a resolute statement, she further pledged the unwavering support of the Government of Pakistan to facilitate implementation and execution of the policy.

After the keynote speeches, the panel discussion was initiated. This panel discussion was moderated by Syed Ishfaq Ur Rehman, Senior Policy Advisor; BRACE TA Project. Based on their specific expertise, each panellist was asked to have their thoughts on the effectiveness of the CLLG Policy. A thorough panel discussion was followed by an interactive question and answer session, as an important input.

During the panel discussion at the Development Partners' Forum, Qadir Ali Nayel, a member of the Balochistan Assembly and the chairman of the standing committee on local government, remarked that Balochistan's local government system has been in place for many years and has experienced several adjustments. Many challenges and hurdles must be overcome in order for the local government system to function better. The Balochistan Local Government Act of 2010 was an important step towards improving local governance in the province.

Ms. Mahjabeen Sheran, Parliamentary Secretary for Women's Development, also spoke on the occasion and discussed the CLLG policy reforms, which give women equal opportunities to participate in development from planning, designing, implementing, and



evaluating from their own perspectives with support from the government and development partners as part of the CLLG Policy implementation. She cited a number of women empowerment programmes that have been launched, including incubation centres, skill development training, and entrepreneurship.

Mr. Zahid Saleem, Secretary of Finance for the Government of Balochistan, emphasised his government's commitment to community-driven reforms at the panel discussion. He stressed that the GoB not only formulated the policy but also enacted its PC-1, allotted PKR 9.2 billion for the CLLG Policy Implementation Programme, and granted PKR 1.5 billion for CLLG policy implementation under the PSDP 2023-24. He also requested that development partners commit to and allocate resources to bridge the PKR 7.7 billion deficit in CLLG reform implementation. He referred to this policy as "sacred" since it was not merely a policy but also enjoyed a legal status.

Mr. Gul Muhammad Mengal, Director Planning & Finance LG and Focal Person BRACE Programme insisted on continued technical assistance to the government in CLLG Policy implementation. He referred to the policy development process where EU-funded Technical Assistance to the Government of Balochistan has played a pivotal role in supporting the Government of Balochistan in realizing the development of CLLG policy and now financial support from development partners is required to ensure that the policy is implemented in its real sense to achieve the desired goals.

Mr. Abdul Hai, a community activist from the Pishin region, stated that the community institutions had evolved over time and were now involved in activities other than the BRACE Programme. He also shared success stories of community-based initiatives, emphasising the importance of community institutions in retaining development investments and a sustainable development process at the grassroots level.

The Asian Development Bank representative complimented the CLLG Policy, compared it to the Bank's plan that the Balochistan government had adopted, and demanded that the policy be implemented if the province was to achieve its ultimate goal of development. He stated that this strategy will allow us to examine community issues in a more systematic manner.

Dr. Inaam Ul Haq from the International Islamic University stated during the panel discussion that academician play an important role in the implementation of CLLG Policy. He underlined the need for academic research to enable efficient planning, execution, and evaluation of community-based programmes in order to learn from experience and make continuous improvements. To effectively execute the policy, he advised implementing social audit, Participatory Rural Appraisal, and knowledge management concepts.

The forum served to integrate the theoretical framework with practical implementation by pooling resources among key stakeholders. The event undoubtedly helped to translate the community-led inclusive vision of governance achieved with the combined efforts of the GoB and the EU-funded technical assistance into visible change.




INTRODUCTION

The Government of Balochistan took a momentous step towards enhancing local governance and community empowerment with the promulgation of its Community Led Local Governance Policy on March 30, 2023. This visionary policy aims to invigorate the local governance structure by actively involving mobilized communities and empowering citizens in the development process. The formulation of this policy was made possible through the valuable collaboration between the European Union-funded BRACE Technical Assistance (TA) Project, key stakeholders from diverse government agencies, and civil society representatives. Notably, this journey toward policy formulation also led to a significant amendment in the Balochistan Local Government Act of 2010, wherein Section 87 was included. This amendment provides a crucial legal foundation to engage community-based organizations in the holistic development process.

Building upon these pivotal achievements, the Government of Balochistan orchestrated the Development Partners' Forum on July 18, 2023, with the unwavering support of the European Union-funded BRACE Technical Assistance Project. This forum stands as a testament to the collective commitment to fostering community-led development and sustainable governance practices.

The Development Partners' Forum on July 18, 2023, served as a collective platform for stakeholders to converge, deliberate, and strategize for the effective execution of the Community-Led Local Governance Policy. The forum's proceedings reflected a mutual aspiration to create sustainable and empowered communities in Balochistan. The event's success lies in its potential to usher in a new era of participatory development, where government, civil society, and development partners collaborate harmoniously to realize the policy's transformative vision. This report aims to provide a comprehensive overview of the event, detailing each agenda item and its proceedings.



PROCEEDINGS OF THE DEVELOPMENT PARTNERS' FORUM

RECITATION OF HOLY QURAN VERSES

The forum commenced with the recitation of the Holy Quran verses, Ar-Rahman 1-16, which resounded with reminders of divine bounties and the message of fairness and justice to handle these resources. The verses highlighted transparency and equitable resource management as a key pointers of the CLLG policy.

KEYNOTE ADDRESSES

The Development Partners' Forum was moderated by Mr. Atif Masud, Deputy Team Leader of BRACE Technical Assistance Project, and keynote addresses by various esteemed speakers and stakeholders of the Government of Balochistan's Community-Led Local Governance Policy. The key note addresses included the opening remarks, presentation on GoB CLLG Policy, Addresses by the representatives of the EUD, EAD, and the Policy Statement of the GoB including a panel discussion by the well-versed panelists from various walks of the development.



WELCOME NOTE ON BEHALF OF THE GOB

Mr Atif Masud invited the Additional Chief Secretary (Dev), Mr Hafiz Abdul Basit, to deliver his welcome note on behalf of the government of Balochistan.

In his address, the Additional Chief Secretary welcomed the representatives of the European Union Delegation to Pakistan, the Asian Development Bank, ILO, and IOM for attending the Development Partners Forum which signified a shared commitment. He appraised the forum that the CLLG policy and the Local Government Act of 2010 provide a legal cover to community-led sustainable development in the province.

The approval of the CLLG policy in March and then the allocation of PKR 1.5 billion within an outlay of PKR 9.2 billion of the current year's PSDP signals the staunch commitment of the GoB towards the current policy.



He also acknowledged challenges in healthcare, drinking water, sustainable economic growth, and infrastructure development that have impeded the prosperity of Balochistan. He acceded that Balochistan has been a region long prone to natural disasters due to climate change. The Additional Chief Secretary highlighted the significance of an innovative policy such as CLLG in changing the developmental landscape of Balochistan, combating the issues mentioned above, as well as providing equal and easy access to resources, improving front-line delivery, and reduction of poverty. He underscored the community-led and community-driven paradigm of the policy, which is fundamental to sustainable development and inclusivity. He affirmed that the policy has part in place transparency frameworks to ensure the proper channelling of resources. Lastly, he added that the translation of this vision into reality required resources and urged all the stakeholders to come forward and join hands for the progress of Balochistan.

SUMMARY OF POLICY STATEMENT BY CHIEF SECRETARY

The Development Partners' Forum of the Government of Balochistan's Community Led Local Governance (CLLG) Policy convened on 18 July 2023, marked a significant milestone in the province's commitment to inclusive and participatory development. The event was graced by the presence of the Chief Secretary of the Government of Balochistan, who delivered a policy statement highlighting the province's vision, achievements, challenges, and future directions in the realm of community-led local governance.

Chief Secretary's Address:

The Chief Secretary, representing the Government of Balochistan, expressed gratitude to the development partners and donors for their unwavering support towards the shared vision of improving the lives of Balochistan's people and advancing the collective development agenda. He emphasized the significance of transitioning from policy design to resource generation and implementation in the ongoing Community Led Local Governance Policy and Implementation Program.

Empowering Local Communities:

The Chief Secretary underscored the transformative nature of the CLLG policy, which places community engagement at its core. He stated that his government's firm belief in empowering local communities and involving them in decision-making processes to foster sustainable development and enhance local governance. Notably, the province successfully conducted local government elections with a turnout exceeding 50%, reflecting the transparency and fairness of the process.





Legal Reforms for Inclusivity:

To ensure inclusivity and participation, the Government of Balochistan introduced legislative and policy reforms that legally support community engagement. These reforms recognize and respect the voices and contributions of all community members, particularly women, children, and girls. The Chief Secretary highlighted the enactment of specific laws and reforms, addressing the importance of these changes.

Development Partner Contributions:

The Chief Secretary expressed appreciation for the European Union's technical assistance in formulating the policy. He acknowledged the role of development partners in bolstering the objectives of the CLLG policy, particularly the significant contributions of the European Union Delegation. He requested the EU's continued technical assistance to effectively implement the policy reforms.

Funding and Collaboration:

While highlighting the provincial government's commitment to the CLLG policy's objectives, the Chief Secretary acknowledged the need for additional funds to realize visible change. He called upon development partners and donors to continue their support, emphasizing the role of the European Union in financially supporting the policy's implementation. The Chief Secretary invited other development partners and stakeholders to collaborate in furthering Balochistan's development agenda.

Transparency and Accountability:

The Chief Secretary acknowledged the importance of effectively channeling government and development partners' funds. He reaffirmed the government's commitment to transparency and accountability in fund management, promising adherence to agreed-upon mechanisms.

A Call for Action:

In conclusion, the Chief Secretary invited all development partners to invest in the CLLG policy and Implementation program. He emphasized that their support would not only contribute to the prosperity of Balochistan's people but also foster a more inclusive and participatory governance model. He highlighted Balochistan's significance as a pivotal province within Pakistan and called for attention and investment to uplift its marginalized communities.

Closing of Policy Statement:

The Chief Secretary expressed gratitude for the active engagement and commitment of development partners to Balochistan's development. He looked forward to a sustained policy dialogue with like-minded partners and welcomed their suggestions. The Chief Secretary emphasized the importance of collective efforts in achieving the objectives of the Community Led Local Governance Policy Implementation Program.

PRESENTATION ON THE CLLG POLICY AND POLICY IMPLEMENTATION PROGRAMME BY MR. DOSTAIN KHAN JAMALDINI (SECRETARY, LG&RDD):

Mr. Dostain Khan Jamaldini, Secretary of the Local Government & Rural Development Department (LG&RDD), provided a comprehensive presentation on the Community Led Local Governance (CLLG) policy and its implementation program during the Development Partners' Forum. His presentation highlighted the policy's structure, framework, and implementation mechanism, emphasizing key aspects that shape the policy's goals and impact.



Policy Structure and Implementation Framework

Secretary Jamaldini delved into the mechanics of the CLLG policy, stressing its distinctive bottom-up and community-led approach rather than the conventional top-down state-led development approaches. He underscored the importance of community participation and inclusivity in the policy framework, aiming to transform the social status of Balochistan's population.

He acknowledged the pivotal role of development partners, particularly the European Union (EU), the World Bank (WB), The Asian Development Bank (ADB), and the United Nations' different agencies as driving forces in Pakistan's development sector.

Learnings from BRACE Programme

- **Enabling Environment** – Institutionalization of the community engagement in the local government system
- **Impact on Poverty** – Scaling up programme across Province. Continuous ownership and support of Government of Balochistan is critical.
- **Resource needed** – Future interventions need more resources to cover the poorest households ie IGGs, TVET, access to finance, etc.
- **Women's participation** – This is 44% of CO membership, 100% in adult literacy centers, 88% IGG beneficiaries, 69% CIF clients. Further strengthening of women's programme recommended – can include certain measures in the procedures to ensure inclusivity

ROLE OF BALOCHISTAN RURAL DEVELOPMENT AND COMMUNITY EMPOWERMENT (BRACE) PROGRAMME

The Secretary expressed appreciation for the Balochistan Rural Development and Community Empowerment Programme (BRACE) and its Technical Assistance component that supported the formulation of the GoB CLLG policy. He highlighted how the insights from the BRACE programme were instrumental in integrating the policy seamlessly into local governance structures. He pointed out that BRACE's contribution led to increased women's participation and reduced gender disparity within an enabling environment.

INCORPORATION OF BRACE LEARNINGS

The presentation emphasized the incorporation of learnings from the BRACE programme. It highlighted how the BRACE programme's success stories and outcomes contributed to the evolution of the GoB CLLG policy, making it more attuned to the needs and aspirations of the local communities and providing GoB a framework for implementation.

CLLG Policy – Goal



To enhance citizens' trust over GoB by providing an enabling environment where empowered & resilient communities could lead in the improvement of public services and development of socio-economic & environmental conditions in a sustainable manner.

POLICY PHILOSOPHY AND GOALS :

During the presentation at the Development Partners Forum, the Secretary of the Local Government and Rural Development Department (LG&RDD) outlined the philosophy of the Community Led Local Governance (CLLG) Policy. The policy's philosophy revolves around enhancing citizens' trust and improving the delivery of public services to the masses. It is aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), directly contributing to SDGs 1-8, 10, 11, 13, and 16, and associated targets, encompassing 41 out of 169 targets. Furthermore, the CLLG Policy integrates with Pakistan's National SDGs Framework, contributing to 29 out of 52 targets linked to SDGs 1-8, 10, 11, 13, and 16. Notably, CLLG aligns with the "high priority targets" defined in the National SDGs Framework.

The policy's approach, which institutionalizes Community-Driven Development (CDD) within an enabling environment, serves as a harbinger of prosperity for women, children, and people living in remote areas.

ROLE OF BALOCHISTAN RURAL DEVELOPMENT ACADEMY:

The Secretary of Local Government and Rural Development highlighted the Balochistan Rural Development Academy's pivotal role in implementing GoB CLLG Policy for capacity building at provincial, districts, Tehsils and Union Council levels. He announced its planned devolution from the provincial level to the district level, emphasizing its role in capacity building, technical assistance, and driving the success of the CLLG policy and implementation programme.



POLICY PRINCIPLES:

The Secretary of the Local Government and Rural Development Department (LG&RDD) highlighted the fundamental principles that underpin the Government of Balochistan's CLLG Policy. These principles form the bedrock of the policy's approach to governance and development in the province. He explained the Policy principles as below:

- **Transparency:** The policy places a strong emphasis on transparency, ensuring that all decision-making processes, resource allocations, and actions taken by local governance institutions are transparent and accessible to the public. Transparency fosters trust and accountability in governance.
- **Accountability:** Accountability is a core tenet, holding local governance institutions responsible for their actions and decisions. Through accountability mechanisms, the government and community institutions are answerable for their performance and use of resources.
- **Responsiveness:** The policy promotes responsiveness, meaning that local governance institutions are attuned to the needs and concerns of the communities they serve. They must promptly address issues and provide solutions to the challenges faced by community members.



POLICY PRINCIPLES:

- **Subsidiarity:** Subsidiarity is a principle that encourages decision-making to occur at the most localized level possible. It ensures that decisions are made by those closest to the issues, allowing for more effective and context-sensitive solutions.
- **Community Institutions Mobilization:** The policy emphasizes the active engagement and mobilization of community-based organizations and institutions. These organizations play a crucial role in facilitating community participation and development initiatives.
- **Empowerment:** Empowerment is a central principle, aiming to empower local communities to take charge of their own development. It involves providing communities with the knowledge, resources, and skills necessary for self-improvement.
- **Inclusivity:** Inclusivity ensures that all segments of society, including women, children, and marginalized groups, have a voice in decision-making and access to the benefits of development. The policy strives to reduce disparities and promote equal participation.



POLICY PRINCIPLES:

- **Community-Level Public-Private Partnerships:** Public-private partnerships at the community level are encouraged to leverage resources, expertise, and innovation from both the public and private sectors. These partnerships are instrumental in addressing the challenges at the community level.
- **Capacity Development:** Capacity development focuses on building the skills, knowledge, and capabilities of local governance institutions and community organizations. It enhances their ability to plan, manage, and implement development initiatives effectively.
- **Transformative Initiatives:** The policy seeks to initiate transformative changes in the province by addressing long-standing development challenges and working towards achieving sustainable, equitable, and inclusive development outcomes.

These principles collectively guide the implementation of the CLLG policy, emphasizing the importance of community participation, empowerment, and partnership between the government and development partners. By adhering to these principles, the Government of Balochistan aims to create a governance framework that is responsive to the needs of its citizens and promotes inclusive and sustainable development in the province.

SCOPE OF THE POLICY:

The Secretary LGRDD explained the scope of GoB Community Led Local Governance (CLLG) policy, by stating that it is deliberately designed to encompass medium and small-sized community interventions. These interventions align closely with the priorities identified by our communities and focus on a variety of Community-led Development Investment sectors. We will be working diligently to enhance skills, boost incomes, improve disaster management capabilities, and invest in community-level critical infrastructure.

Specifically, the policy emphasizes the importance of medium and small-scale Community-Led Interventions. This approach allows GoB to address the unique needs and challenges faced by our communities effectively. To ensure the success of these interventions, we are actively promoting co-funding, component-sharing arrangements, and collaborative projects. These efforts will involve close cooperation between various stakeholders, including our local government departments such as Planning and Development, Finance, and the Balochistan Rural Development Academy, among others.

GoB indicative interventions under the CLLG policy encompass a broad spectrum of community needs. We are committed to supporting income-generating activities, enhancing skills within our communities, and developing critical physical infrastructure, including community water supply, sanitation, street sewerage, drainage, and integrated solid waste management. Additionally, we are keenly focused on addressing climate change-related challenges and incorporating sustainable practices into our initiatives.

In line with our collaborative approach, we encourage joint efforts between departments, non-government stakeholders, and the relevant community institutions. This collaborative spirit is fundamental to the success of our CLLG policy and ensures that our community-led interventions are not only impactful but also sustainable, resilient, and responsive to the unique needs of our communities.



POLICY FRAMEWORKS:

The presentation by the Secretary LG&RDD outlined the frameworks of GoB Community Led Local Governance Policy (CLLG).

1. **GoB CLLG Policy Framework:** This is the overarching framework that sets the strategic direction and principles for the CLLG Policy. It defines the objectives, priorities, and key strategies to promote community-led local governance, ensuring that the policy's goals are aligned with the broader development agenda of Balochistan.
2. **Fiscal Framework:** The fiscal framework outlines the financial aspects of the policy, including the allocation of resources, budgeting, and financial management. It establishes the mechanisms for funding CLLG initiatives and ensures that financial resources are efficiently and transparently utilized to support community development projects.
3. **Institutional Framework:** This framework defines the organizational structure and roles of various institutions responsible for implementing the CLLG Policy. It outlines the division of responsibilities among government departments, community institutions, and other stakeholders, ensuring effective coordination and collaboration.
4. **Regulatory Framework:** The regulatory framework consists of laws, policies, and regulations that govern the implementation of the CLLG Policy. It provides a legal basis for community participation, decision-making processes, and the establishment of community-driven initiatives.
5. **Capacity Building:** Capacity building is a critical framework that focuses on enhancing the knowledge, skills, and capacities of individuals and institutions involved in CLLG initiatives. It ensures that stakeholders have the necessary tools and expertise to successfully implement community-led projects and programs.
6. **CLLG Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability, & Learning (MEAL) Framework:** This framework establishes mechanisms for monitoring and evaluating the progress and impact of CLLG initiatives. It includes systems for collecting data, assessing outcomes, and ensuring accountability in the implementation process. Additionally, it emphasizes a culture of learning and adaptability, allowing for continuous improvement based on lessons learned.

CLLG Programme Operationalization Timeline



POLICY OPERATIONALISATION:

During the presentation at the Development Partners Forum, the Secretary of the Local Government and Rural Development Department (LG&RDD) provided valuable insights into the operationalization timeline, fiscal framework, and implementation program of the Community Led Local Governance (CLLG) policy. The presentation detailed the nuts and bolts of the policy, including its financing mechanisms and resource management strategies.

It is noteworthy that the Government of Balochistan successfully launched the CLLG Policy in June 2023, marking a significant milestone in the province's development agenda. To kick-start the policy's implementation, the GoB has allocated a public sector outlay of PKR 9.2 billion for the first five years. The policy's initial phase will focus on ten districts, with pilot programs in three districts and subsequent expansion to the remaining seven districts.

Despite fiscal challenges, the provincial government has demonstrated its strong commitment by allocating PKR 1.5 billion to initiate the implementation process, serving as a demonstration of its dedication to the policy's success.

However, it's important to highlight that launching a full-fledged CLLG Policy Implementation Programme requires additional resources. The GoB currently faces a resource gap of PKR 7.7 billion (approximately 25 million Euros or 27 million US Dollars). To bridge this gap and ensure the successful implementation of the policy, the Government of Balochistan requires continued technical assistance funded by the European Union Delegation during the initial phase.

In light of these considerations, the Secretary LG&RDD earnestly appealed to the development partners and donors to come forward and contribute to the success of this landmark policy. Their support is essential in closing the resource gap and realizing the full potential of the CLLG Policy for the benefit of Balochistan's communities.

SUMMARY OF MR. STEPHEN LANGRELL'S (REPRESENTATIVE EUD) ADDRESS

Mr Stephen Langrell, on behalf of the European Union Delegation in Pakistan, expressed pleasure on behalf of the EUD to participate in shaping the GoB CLLG policy. He affirmed the shared commitment of the EU to the CLLG policy for sustainable development and commended the GoB for the policy, grounded from the lessons of the BRACE programme. He further added that the EU recognizes Balochistan as a priority area and reassured EU's sustained investments for the development of the province.

He asserted the unwavering support of the European Union towards the Community Led Local Governance (CLLG) policy, a testament to its collective pursuit of sustainable development. Additionally, he lauded the Government of Balochistan (GoB) for its strong commitment to this policy, which stands firmly rooted in the invaluable insights gleaned from the EU-funded transformative and impactful BRACE programme. This commendation serves as a testament to the GoB's profound understanding of the imperative need to continue fostering sustainable practices in the development interventions adopted by the GoB such as the CLLG Policy.



Mr. Langrell emphatically reiterated the continued quest of the European Union to uphold the pillars of accountability and transparency, which are steadfast pillars ensuring the continuous journey towards a sustainable future. This pursuit of accountability and transparency serves as a cornerstone of the EU's enduring objective to foster an inclusive and prosperous society built on trust, credibility, and lasting sustainability.

Speaking on behalf of the European Union, he expressed that the current state of Balochistan, in the aftermath of the devastating floods, is a reality that should not escape our collective attention. He reached out to other partners, urging them to join forces in a concerted effort to swiftly allocate funds and establish vital infrastructure. Recognizing the urgency, he emphasized the imperative of timely action to alleviate the challenges faced by the resilient people of Balochistan, on their road to recovery and rebuilding begins.

SUMMARY OF MS. SAMAR EHSAN'S (ADDITIONAL SECRETARY EAD) ADDRESS:

In her address, Ms Samar Ihsan, the Additional Secretary of the Economic Affairs Division, applauded the Government of Balochistan for its concerted efforts and strong commitment. She expressed her satisfaction with the progress and the robust framework of the policy. Ms. Ihsan further highlighted the pivotal role played by the BRACE initiative in overcoming various challenges. Nevertheless, she emphasized the importance of addressing climate-induced losses and ensuring food security as crucial components of the project. Moreover, she extended her heartfelt gratitude to the European Union support which spearheaded the CLLG policy and drove it forward.

She requested the EU's fiscal and technical assistance and reaffirmed EAD's continued support for a smooth funneling of resources from developmental partners to the GoB.





PANEL DISCUSSION AT THE CLLG DEVELOPMENT PARTNERS' FORUM

The panel discussion held during the GoB Community Led Local Governance Policy's Development Partners Forum was crucial in obtaining a number of beneficial outcomes. The conversation gave a variety of opinions and educated insights on the GoB CLLG Policy and related issues by bringing together professionals, stakeholders, and community members. Furthermore, audience engagement promoted feedback and clarity. The event's media coverage helped raise awareness, and the useful comments gathered during the discussion will be utilized to modify and improve policy implementation.

The panel discussion was moderated by Syed Ishfaq Ur Rehman, Senior Policy Advisor from EU-funded BRACE Technical Assistance Project. A summary of the panel discussion is presented below focussing on each panelist and the questions being responded by them.





QUESTION

WILL THE POLICY PROVE CRUCIAL IN BRIDGING THE GAP BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF BALOCHISTAN AND THE COMMUNITIES?

PANELIST/RESPONDENT:

Mr. QADIR ALI NAYEL
(MPA and CHAIRMAN STANDING COMMITTEE) :

Mr Qadir Ali Nayel, a member of the Balochistan Assembly and the chairman of the standing committee on local government reforms, stated during the panel discussion at the development partners' forum that Balochistan's local government system has existed for many years and has undergone numerous changes. The local government system needs to work better. Thus, many problems and obstacles need to be solved. A significant step towards enhancing local administration in the province was the Balochistan Local Government Act of 2010. But as time passed, further changes were required to strengthen the system's performance. GoB CLLG policy, which has been covered under the Balochistan Local Government Act. 2010 amended in 2022, has constitutionally opened doors for donors to contribute and partner up with the local government to work towards the common cause, the welfare of the Balochistan community. This landmark achievement has brought the Government of Balochistan and the local communities closer to work together to fight poverty in at the grassroots level.



QUESTION

DO YOU THINK CLLG POLICY WILL ASSIST WOMEN AND MINORITY RIGHTS?

RESPONDENT:

Ms MAHJABEEN SHEERAN
(PARLIAMENTARY SECRETARY FOR WOMEN) :

Ms Mahjabeen answered the question by stating that the GoB CLLG policy reforms, which give women equal opportunities to participate in development from planning, designing, implementing, and evaluating from their perspectives with support from the government and development partners under the implementation of the CLLG Policy. She elaborated on various issues women face, like gender-based violence, healthcare, and education, and how they are trying to eradicate such problems. She mentioned multiple initiatives of the Government of Balochistan for women's empowerment, such as business incubation centers, skill development training, and entrepreneurship, and linked GoB CLLG Policy's principles which emphasize the inclusiveness in all forms for all the marginalized groups including Women, elderly, persons with disabilities and the minorities. She insisted on implementation of the policy principles which will ensure the rights of the women and the minorities.



QUESTION

IS THE GOVERNMENT WILLING TO ALLOCATE ENOUGH RESOURCES TO EXPAND THE PROJECT?

RESPONDENT:

Mr. ZAHID SALEEM

(SECRETARY FINANCE Department GoB):

In response to the question, Mr Zahid Saleem, the Secretary for the GoB Finance Department explained the commitment of the government of Balochistan to community-driven reforms. He emphasized that the GoB developed the CLLG policy, approved it at the GoB steering committee level, and was promulgated by the provincial cabinet which led to its PC-1 formulation and approval and subsequently, allocation of overall PKR 9.2 billion outlay for the CLLG Policy Implementation Programme, including the approval of PKR 1.5 billion under the PSDP 2023–24 for implementing the CLLG policy programme. This reflects The willingness and commitment of the GoB towards the resource allocation and expansion of the CLLG Policy implementation programme. He stressed that the GoB do have resource constraints and therefore, this development partners forum is organized to seek the support of the development partners to make up the shortfall of PKR 7.7 billion for implementing the CLLG reforms. He dubbed this policy “sacred” as it was not only a policy but a legal act. He also hoped for CLLG to develop mechanisms that will enable it to include 26 other districts to match the policy principle of inclusivity.



QUESTION

WHAT KIND OF RELATIONSHIP WILL THE GOVERNMENT AND THE COMMUNITY ORGANISATIONS HAVE AND WILL THIS POLICY COMPLIMENT OR CONTRADICT THAT RELATIONSHIP?

RESPONDENT:

MR . GUL MUHAMMAD MENGAL
(DIRECTOR PLANNING AND FINANCE LGRDD - Focal Person for
BRACE Programme):

Mr. Gul Muhammad Mengal, Director of Planning and Finance BLGB and Focal Person for the BRACE Programme explained the government's efforts in CLLG Policy formulation and implementation and informed the forum participants that GoB Policy is instrumental in creating a formal relationship between the Government and the community institutions to work together on development interventions. he stated that before the introduction of this policy, there was no formal arrangements existed in the GoB processes and the development process was mainly comprised of the conventional approaches of top-down development while this landmark policy now enables bottom-up planning of the communities integrating in the top-down investments. This reflects that both, the government of Balochistan and the community organizations will be working to complement each other's efforts towards the development of their localities. He underscored that proper guidelines and frameworks have been developed under the policy framework to resolve any conflict of interests amicably.

He requested development partners to extend their empirically evident support which is necessary to ensure the policy is implemented and the envisaged outcomes of the CLLG policy are achieved for the community-led local development in the province.



QUESTION

DOES THE ASIAN DEVELOPMENT BANK FORESEE A PARTNER COLLABORATION WITH REGARDS TO THE POLICY?

RESPONDENT:

MR .ASAD ALI ZAFAR

(SENIOR REGIONAL OFFICER, ASIAN DEVELOPMENT BANK):

During the panel discussion, a pertinent question was raised regarding the Asian Development Bank's (ADB) potential collaboration with regard to the Government of Balochistan's Community Led Local Governance (CLLG) Policy. Mr. Asad Ali Zafar, a delegate from the Asian Development Bank, provided valuable insights into the matter.

Mr. Zafar began by highly commending the GoB CLLG Policy, which was presented at the Development Partners Forum. He acknowledged that this policy aligns closely with the strategic approach that the government of Balochistan has embraced—a strategy that the ADB also finds resonance with.

In his response, Mr. Zafar emphasized that the policy must not remain a theoretical concept but should be swiftly translated into action if the province is to attain its ultimate aim of development. He underscored that this policy represents a pivotal step towards looking at community matters in a more structured manner and adopting a practical approach to its implementation. He recognized the inherent potential of the CLLG Policy to bring about transformative changes at the grassroots level.

Mr. Zafar also highlighted the alignment between the CLLG Policy's objectives and the ADB's development priorities in the region. He stated that for ADB, the GoB CLLG Policy provides rounds for exploring collaborative opportunities that may leverage expertise, resources, and experience in fostering sustainable development.



QUESTION

HOW DO YOU SEE THE ROLE OF THE AMENDMENT ACT AND THE POLICY FROM THE PERSPECTIVE OF THE COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS?

RESPONDENT:

MR . ABDUL HAI
(COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ADVOCATE) :

Mr Abdul Hai, a community activist from the District Pishin, remarked that the community institutions had matured over time and have been participating in activities apart from the current project. He remarked on how this project has taken the shape of a policy that has become an excellent leverage for them. He also recounted successful examples of community-based interventions in which community institutions are crucial to maintaining development investments and a sustained development process at the grassroots level.

He commended the amendment of Balochistan Local Government Act. under section 87 that enables community institutions to participate in the development process form partnerships with the GoB and undertake the community-based small-scale projects aligned to the community needs.



QUESTION

WHAT ROLE CAN THE ACADEMIA PLAY IN IMPLEMENTATION OF POLICY MAKING PROCESSES?

RESPONDENT:

DR . INAM UL HAQ KHILJI

(SENIOR DIRECTOR INTERNATIONAL ISLAMIC UNIVERSITY, ISLAMABAD) :

During the panel discussion, a question from the moderator was asked regarding the significant role that academia could play in the implementation of policy-making processes. Dr. Inam Ul Haq from the International Islamic University shed light on the pivotal contribution of academia.

He underscored the critical importance of academia's involvement in the CLLG Policy's development and execution. He emphasized that academic institutions possess a wealth of expertise and research capabilities that can greatly enhance policy formulation and implementation. Academic research, rooted in data and evidence, can provide valuable insights for effective planning, execution, and evaluation of community-based initiatives.

Moreover, Dr. Inam Ul Haq highlighted the policy-improving potential of academic insights. He noted that academia enables policymakers to draw from past experiences, learn from best practices, and continually enhance policy outcomes. To strengthen the implementation of the CLLG Policy, he recommended incorporating mechanisms such as social audits, Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA), and third-party evaluations to ensure transparency, accountability and imperative revision to the policy.



Lastly, Dr. Inam Ul Haq emphasized the significance of knowledge management, which involves systematically organizing and sharing relevant information and expertise. Effective knowledge management, he asserted, empowers policymakers to make informed decisions and enhance the overall impact of the policy.

In summary, Dr. Inam Ul Haq's insights shed light on the indispensable role that academia can play in advancing the GoB CLLG Policy's objectives. His recommendations underscored the potential for fruitful collaboration between academia and government agencies and the communities in realizing the vision of inclusive and participatory local governance in Balochistan.

Mr. Gul Mohammad Mengal stated that the CLLG Policy is a dynamic document that can be revised periodically. He stressed the importance of accommodating changes as per the evolving needs and circumstances over time based on evidence based research.



OPEN DISCUSSION SESSION WITH THE AUDIENCE:

AFTER PANEL DISCUSSION, THE FLOOR WAS OPEN FOR PARTICIPANTS OF DEVELOPMENT PARTNERS' FORUM. THE AUDIENCE ASKED QUESTIONS AND THE PANELIST PROVIDED CLARITY.

- ▶ Participants in the session engaged in constructive exchanges, seeking clarity and expressing their thoughts on the CLLG Policy. The panellists listened carefully to the questions and took notes on the useful comments and observations for future joint endeavours.
- ▶ During the session, Mr Mahmood Ahmad Cheema, Country Director of the IUCN congratulated the team on the successful event and commended the dedicated efforts to upscale the CLLG initiative. He emphasised the need to reconsider primary stakeholders, highlighting agriculture, livestock, railway, and water sectors as crucial for achieving development in Balochistan. Proper management of natural resources was discussed, and Mr Cheema shared valuable insights from his experience from the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN).



OPEN DISCUSSION SESSION WITH THE AUDIENCE:

- ▶ Mr Fayaz Mohammad from Oxford Policy Management expressed his appreciation for the excellent initiative and sought further clarification on the mechanics of the CLLG policy as a legal act. He inquired about the possibility of registering new organisations under this framework. In response, Mr Gul explained that community institutions meeting the minimum qualifications could be registered under BCCRA. Doing so makes them eligible to operate within the policy implementation and access government funds to support their initiatives.
- ▶ A question by Ms. Sumaira from the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) regarding the registration and participation of the community organization in the implementation of GoB CLLG Policy implementation prompted Mr. Dostain to respond and state that the Charity Act and the Local Government Act of the Balochistan Government will cover the registered community organisations. He said that the implementation manual was being finalised regarding how communities will be engaged.



OPEN DISCUSSION SESSION WITH THE AUDIENCE:

- Another question from Oxford Policy Management representative about ensuring female participation and the lessons learned along the way was responded by Mr. Gul Muhammad Mengal who briefed the forum about the percentage of community organizations and LSOs exclusively managed by women under the BRACE programme. He highlighted certain instances in the history of Balochistan where valuable lessons were gained that have now been made a part of GoB CLLG policy. Mr Dostain added to the answer by mentioning reports of women's participation in the community and local governance and the policy principle of inclusiveness which warrants equal women's participation.
- A journalist from ARY News directed a question to Mr. Abdul Hai (The community worker from Pishin district), inquiring about strategies to instill a sense of ownership among the local communities of Balochistan. In response, Mr. Abdul Hai emphasized that a sense of responsibility emerges from the community's genuine needs. He expressed his observation that the community has shown a strong understanding of the significance of reforms and has embraced a sense of ownership by actively addressing specific issues and prioritising the needs of their community.
- The panel discussion was concluded on a hopeful and fruitful note. Valuable feedback and insights were provided which indicated a collaborative and constructive environment. The panelists and the audience engaged in intellectual discussions and exhibited enthusiasm for the policy. The open discussion welcomed any constructive feedback and provided immense clarity.



CONCLUSION

The Development Partners Forum for the Government of Balochistan's Community Led Local Governance (CLLG) Policy, convened on July 18, 2023, was a pivotal event that showcased the commitment and collaborative spirit driving Balochistan's journey towards inclusive and community-led governance. This section of the report concluded the event and sheds light on the essence of the development partners forum and integrates the key takeaways and insights gathered throughout the event.

Throughout the full day event, distinguished speakers and panelists offered profound insights into the GoB CLLG Policy and its potential to reshape Balochistan's governance landscape.




FIGURE 1: Community Livelihood Empowerment through CIF, ICG and TVET for Poor Households in Balochistan: a study by Institute for Public Opinion Research (IPOR) (2023)








